


PRODUCTION EMPLOYING RECYCLATE (GLASS)






- 1. SUPPORTED SMALL, THOUGH SIGNIFICANT PORTION OF POPULATION IN LARGE CITY ANALOGOUS TO ROMAN TOWNS.
- 2. OFFERED EMPLOYMENT TO PERSONS OF ALL AGES AND BOTH GENDERS.
- 3. FOCUSED ON ONE PRINCIPAL RECYCLABLE, BUT ALSO INVOLVED SEVERAL OTHERS.
- 4. FACILIATED BY COMPLEX, HIERARCHICHAL SYSTEM THAT INVOLVED SPECIALIZED MIDDLEMEN.
- 5. ALLOWED SOME PARTICIPANTS TO BECOME WEALTHY.
- 6. MUNICIPAL ADMINISTRATION INTERESTED IN AND REGULATED IT.


















SUPPLY BY SPECIALIZED WASTE PICKERS (AMBULATORES)







a description of the RMCL facility


